(Doctorate of Oriental Ecclesiastical Sciences), Pontifical Oriental Institute, Rome 2007 Concentration: Eastern Liturgies. He is President of both the Commission on Inter-Church Relations and Educational Development (CIRED).

Sargon Dadisho (Ceres, California)

Sargon is a founder of Bet-Nahrain Democratic Party and Assyrian National Congress. Currently, he is the president and owner of KBSV TV. The Government of Iraq tried to assassinate him, and he sued the Government of Iraq and won. Sargon is an author. He holds a PhD degree in the biological sciences.



Younadam Kanna (Baghdad, Iraq)

Younadam is the Secretary General of the Assyrian Democratic Movement (Zawaa). He is the former Kurdistan Regional Government Minister of Labour. Younadam is a member of the National Assembly of Iraq representing Al Rafideen National List. He Holds a BS degree in Civil Engineering.

In 2017, Gamri was the president of the Assyrian Confederation of Europe, a nongovernmental organization that represents Assyrians living in the European Union.



Mar Meelis Zaya (Sydney, Australia)

Mar Meelis Zaya is the Metropolitan of the Archdiocese of Australia, New Zealand, and Lebanon. He achieved many projects such as establishing Assyrian schools and strengthening the Assyrian church in Australia.



Mar Awraham Youkhanis (London, England)

Mar Awraham Youkhanis is the Bishop of the Diocese of Western Europe of the Assyrian Church of the East. A very charismatic and energetic Bishop and a role model for the Assyrian youth.



Chorbishop Benyamin Betyadgar (Tblisi, Georgia)

Chorbishop Benyamin Betyadgar studies in Pontificia Universita Urbaniana in Rome. He is the head of the Assyrian Church in Georgia.



Ashur Giwargis (Beirut, Lebanon)

Ashur is an Assyrian activist and outspoken politician. He is the leader of the Assyrian Patriotic Movement. Ashur is a role model for Assyrian nationalism.



Gabriel Moushe Gawrieh (Syria)

Emanuel Khoshaba Youkhana (Iraq)

Emanuel is the president of the Assyrian Patriotic Party, based in Iraq. He became part of the party's council in 2002. He is a politician and activist. He gained the popular vote in the previous Iraqi election. He graduated from Baghdad Institute of Technology in 1984.




Sargis Sangari (Skokie, Illinois)

Lieutenant colonel, Sangari has been a veteran of the United States Army Infantry and Special Operational Forces for more than 20 years. He is the founder and president of the United Assyrian Appeal. He is the Chief Executive Officer of the Near East Center for Strategic Engagement.



Marta Youeel Eshoo (Europe)

Marta is an Assyrian activist and the current president of the Assyrian Federation of Europe.



Pascal Warda (Iraq)

Pascal is a former Minister of Immigration and Refugees in the Iraqi Interim Government. She helped in finding the Hammurabi Human Rights Organization, a non-profit group that monitors and opposes human rights violations against members of Iraq's minority groups. Since 2015, she served as the president of the Assyrian Women's Union in Baghdad. She holds a master's degree in human rights studies from the University of Lyon.



Carlo Ganjeh (Los Angeles, California)

Carlo is an Assyrian activist. He is the Secretary General of the Assyrian Universal Alliance.



William Bnyameen Adam (Ankawa, Iraq)

He is better known as Khlapieel Bnyameen. He is an Assyrian activist. He is also a documentary filmmaker and a journalist. He was jailed for helping the Assyrians in Syria. His release came after a worldwide Assyrian outcry.



Isa Yaramis (Paris, France)

Isa is the president of the Assyro-Chaldean Association of France.



Samar George (Khabour, Syria)

Samar is a soldier in the Assyrian Khabour Guards. In 2016, photos of Samar kneeling over her husband's casket went viral after he was killed in action just months after they'd married. Not long afterwards, photos surfaced of Samar in uniform, training with the Khabour Guards. She decided to honor her husband's sacrifice and carry on his mission by taking his place on the battlefield, defending Assyrian lands against terrorism and other threats.



Anna Eshoo (Washington DC, USA)

Rep. Congresswoman Eshoo was born of Assyrian and Armenian heritage. Eshoo is a graduate of Cañada College and the CORO Foundation. She was awarded an honorary Degree by Menlo College and was elected to the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors in 1982. She served on the County Board for 10 years before being elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1992.



Jon Koriel (San Francisco, California)

Jon is a chairman of the Assyrian Policy Institute. He holds a master's degree in public policy from Pepperdine University.



Sabri Atman (Los Angeles, California)

Sabri is a director of Seyfo Center. He is actively seeking awareness and recognition for the WW1 Assyrian genocide.



Ken Joseph Jr. (Tokyo, Japan)

Ken is the first person who raised the Assyrian flag in Iraq. Ken is a protestant minister in Japan. He is a columnist in The Japan Times. He was a visiting professor at Chiba University. Ken was a chair member of the American Chamber of Commerce of Japan.



Zaya Younan (California)

Zaya is the founder and CEO of Zaya Properties, Inc. He is a businessman who accumulated his wealth in real estate. He is an inventor and holds a degree in Mechanical Engineering.



Nuri Kino (Stockholm, Sweden)

Nuri is an Assyrian Swedish journalist and an Assyrian activist.



Savina Dawood (California)

Savina is the co-founder of Etuti Institute. She is active in voicing human rights violations against Assyrians in Iraq and Syria. She has dedicated her life to humanitarian work, entering conflict zones and providing food, shelter, water, and medicine to internally displaced people. She worked to empower Assyrian children and young adults in Iraq and Syria in the hopes of creating a new generation of leaders in the Assyrian homeland.



Maryam Shamalta (San Jose, California)

Maryam has quickly become a household name in the Assyrian community worldwide. Maryam uses her weekly television program Shamiram Media as a platform to empower Assyrians.



Janna Yukhanova (Russia)

Janna is an Assyrian activist and president of Hagyana Atouraya Broadcasting & Media Production Company. She is talented in conducting interviews with Assyrians around the world.



Ronald Michael, MD (Indiana)

Ron was the founder of the Assyrian American League. He sent a lobbyist to Washington, DC to lobby on behalf of the Assyrians. In 2003 and before the invasion of Iraq, Ron was instrumental in urging President George Bush to warn Iraqi officials not to harm Assyrians. He is a neurosurgeon and likes to collect Assyrian books in his spare time.



Robert DeKelaita (Illinois)

Robert is an Assyrian activist and an attorney. He is a co-founder of Ashurbanipal Library in Lincolnwood, Illinois.. His master's degree thesis from University of Chicago is about Assyrians. He teaches Assyrian history at the Assyrian Cultural Foundation.



Tiglat Issabey (Illinois)

Tiglat is the director of the Assyrian Cultural Foundation. He is an Assyrian artist and a businessman.



Joseph V. Danavi, DO (Indiana)

Joseph is an Assyrian activist and the internal affair director of Gishru. He is a cardiologist.



Morris Dal (Germany)

Morris is an Assyrian activist. He is passionate about preserving the identity of our next generation. Morris was born in Tur Abdin and frequently visits his hometown.

Suzy David (Sydney, Australia)

Suzy is a Solicitor and an Assyrian activist. She is an advisor to the Australian Assyrian Universal Alliance branch. She was awarded Assyrian Australian Woman of the Year for her role in Assyrian genocide and plenty.




Ashor Bet Chamoun (Phoenix, AZ)


David Esha (California)

Februniye is an Assyrian activist. In 2015, at age 26, she was elected as comayor of Mardin, Turkey.



Rosie Malek-Yonan (California)

Rosie has gained international recognition as an actress, author, and activist. She is a descendant of one of the oldest and most prominent Assyrian families. Rosie has dedicated much of her career to advocating for the rights of Assyrians, using her platform to bring attention to the Assyrian Genocide of 1914-1918.



Ibrahim Baylan (Sweden)

Ibrahim has been a member of the Swedish Riksdag since 2006. A Swedish politician who served as Minister for Schools from 2004 to 2006, Minister for Energy from 2014 to 2019, Minister for Policy Coordination from 2016 to 2019 and Minister for Business, Industry and Innovation from 2019 to 2021.



Helena Guergis (Ontario, Canada)

Helena is a Canadian politician. She represented the Ontario riding of Simcoe. She is a former member of parliament representing Ontario Providence from 2006-2011.

Edmond is an Assyrian activist. He cares dearly about our next generation. He is an optometrist.




Arsen Mikhaylov (Arzni, Armenia)


Mar Gewargis Younan (Chicago, Illinois)
